THE SACRAMENT OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

It is written that "the Lord Jesus, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it, and said, 'This is my body which is broken for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' In the same way, also He took the cup, after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.' For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes."

**Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of hosts,
heaven and earth are full of Thy glory,
glory be to Thee, O Lord most high.**

All glory be to You, O God, for Jesus Christ your Son,

who was born of Mary, shared our weakness, was tempted in every way like us, suffered and died for us upon the cross, and was raised from the dead by your power, the victor over sin and death, Lord of creation and Head of the Church.

**Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest!**

Grant, O Lord, by your Holy Spirit, that the bread we break and the cup we share may be for us a means of grace; that, receiving them, we may be made one with Christ, and He with us, and remain faithful members of His body until we feast with Him anew in His kingdom.
